# Call for Symposia and Abstracts

## Detailed Guidelines

The World Congress in 2010 welcomes ISBRA members, as well as scientific and clinical colleagues from around the world. The program will have relevance to laboratory scientists, clinicians who treat alcohol-related disorders, clinical researchers and policy makers.

The International Program Committee (IPC) is sculpting a congress with world-renowned plenary speakers each morning, and up to 72 symposia, workshops and roundtable discussion sessions.

Specific symposia categories are shown in the preliminary program timetable and listed below. The topics represented and the balance of the overall conference program will be determined by the proposals submitted for consideration. There will be provision for up to 400 poster presentations in the range of topics outlined.

All speakers and poster presenters should register before the meeting. Travel award application forms will be available on the website on January 8, 2010: the requested NIAAA grant will be used to cover partial expenses for some US and non-US speakers and the funds will be provided after the congress.

Authors must categorize their proposals using this list. It will help the IPC organize the sessions.

## ■ Symposium Proposal Instructions

Symposia will be scheduled for one hour and a half, which will allow for up to 4 speakers. In any case, no more than 5 participants will be accepted, one or two chairs included. A discussant will be considered as a speaker. The Organizer of the symposium should fill in a **Symposium submission form** and provide an overall description of the proposed symposium, including background and rationale, and the title of each presentation, with the name and affiliation of each presenter.

The Organizer is then responsible for instructing each speaker to submit an individual detailed abstract of her/his presentation by the symposia proposal deadline, that is February 15, 2010. The Organizer will also remind every speaker and co-chair to register.

An international representation of speakers is desirable. All submissions must be in English. In addition, the IPC has determined that an individual should participate in no more than 2 symposia. The IPC will give particular attention to the presence of enough women, junior investigators from different institutions and various minorities in the final program of the congress.

## ■ Abstracts Proposal Instructions

Each speaker participating in a symposium should fill in a **Speaker Abstract submission form** online by the proposal deadline, that is February 15, 2010. Please carefully do it for your abstract not to be rejected by the computer system.

### Individual Speaker Abstracts are also welcome.

If accepted as such, the oral presentation will be included in a symposium or a round table discussion. Please specify if you would like your abstract considered for poster presentation if not part of a program.

All oral presentations need to be Power Point ones. The Organizer of each session will be required to bring a USB Key with the four presentations on it.

Posters can be submitted until March 31, 2010 using the **Poster Abstract submission form**. Some of the posters accepted may be selected for an oral presentation.
